White Nightmare (Short Film)

Adapted from a famous strip cartoon by cult author Moebius, about racism in the suburbs. Four incompetent racist white men go on the rampage in a suburb one night, bent on attacking an Arab man. Their attacks comically backfire : they crash into a phone booth, on of them is knocked down, another pretends to be a policeman only to be arrested by a real (black) policeman... Until we discover that this was all a nightmare. As the four men wake up in the film's chilling coda off-screen, they beat the Arab man, until he is left lying on the ground.





Meanwhile, Anna runs around the island getting involved in all kinds of typically Icelandic adventures, as her kitchen fills up with customers/ friends, waiting for her to come back and sell them their daily grass.

From September 1973, after the military coup led by General Pinochet, the Italian embassy in Santiago has hosted hundreds and hundreds of asylum seekers.

Through interviews with the protagonists, SANTIAGO, ITALIA tells the story of that dramatic period, during which some Italian diplomats have made possible the salvation of many human lives.



I am Self-Sufficient

(lo Sono Un Autarchico)

One of Moretti's first critically-recognized works, this is a daring, auto-biographical, very amusing look at a young performer, Michele, struggling to survive in Rome's underground theater movement by producing a play with his friends - only to have it flop and destroy his marriage.



Ecce Bombo

Moretti's second feature plays out as a sardonic series of "fumetti" following a group of young Italians as they struggle to come to terms with growing up in an unfeeling world. Michele (Nanni Moretti) goes from one girlfriend to the next and has a difficult relationship with his family, but following a series of political and amorous misadventures, he and his friends decide to take life more seriously. Michele is the only one who keeps the resolution. One of Moretti's most radical films, Ecce Bombo established him as both a gifted comedian and a vocal critic of modern Italian culture and politics.

One of Moretti's wildest pictures relentlessly parodies the Italian film business as well as everything from TV game shows to Sigmund Freud. With more than a nod to Fellini's 8-1/2, Moretti stars as a self-obsessed director who constantly daydreams scenes from his imaginary opus.



La Cosa Documentary

1990 – 59 min – Political Documentary – Italian

The events that led to the fall of the Berlin Wall and the end of the Cold War prompted changes in the Italian Communist Party (PCI), which in 1989 announced a historical svolta (sharp turn). A companion piece to Nanni's 1989 Palombella Rossa, this documentary tackles the future of the PCI and the future, if any, of a socialistic utopia. Nanni Moretti comments: La Cosa isn't a cinema citation; it's the term people used for what was coming into being - this "cosa" which would replace the old Communist Party. From the confronting debates depicted to the re-evocation of the history of the Italian Left and of its founding principles, Moretti expresses here a nostalgic longing for a style of politics that has disappeared in Italy.

The Gods decide to put them out of their misery by turning them into stone and freezing them for eternity on that rock. The cliff is now called La Pierre de l'Attente. The Waiting Stone.



The Married Woman of Nam Xuong (Short Film)

The story of a Vietnamese peasant who goes off to war, leaving behind wife and child. In order to recreate his presence at home, the mother casts his shadow every night against a sheet of linen. But when the father comes home, his child doesn't recognize him at all...

In Rome, Claude Lanzmann filmed a series of interviews with Benjamin Murmelstein, the last President of the Jewish Council of Elders in the Theresienstadt ghetto in Czechoslovakia, the only "Jewish elder" (according to Nazi terminology) not to have been killed during the war. A rabbi in Vienna, following the annexation of Austria by Germany in 1938 Murmelstein fought bitterly with Adolf Eichmann, week after week for seven years, managing to help around 121,000 Jews leave the country, and preventing the liquidation of the ghetto.

2012. Claude Lanzmann, at 87, exhumes these interviews from Rome, returning to Theresienstadt, the town "given to the Jews by Hitler", a so-called model ghetto, but a deceitful ghetto chosen by Eichmann to dupe the world. We discover the extraordinary personality of Benjamin Murmelstein: a man blessed with a dazzling intelligence and a certain courage which, along with an unrivaled memory, makes him a wonderfully wry, sardonic and authentic storyteller.
